The purpose of the St. John Chrysostom Oratorical Festival is to give our youth the opportunity to learn and speak about their beliefs, their Church, and their heritage in order to strengthen their understanding and appreciation of their identity as Greek Orthodox Christians.

ST. JOHN CHRYSOSTOM was born in the ancient city of Antioch in 347 AD to a noble and pious family. He studied to be a lawyer and was an exceptional student. He was led to a religious life where he devoted himself to discipline and spiritual growth. As a priest, St. John had the innate quality of winning the hearts of his audience, even though many times he would chastise them. He loved his people and would hold nothing back in order to inspire, challenge and paternally lead them into upright living. He was also a great advocate of social justice and proclaimed the equality of all people before God. At the age of forty-nine he became Patriarch of Constantinople. He was an outspoken critic of the imperial court, and after a series of exiles and returns, he was banished in 403 and died two years later. He earned the title Chrysostomos ("Golden Mouth") because of his dynamic and forthright preaching. As one of our most honored Church Fathers, Patriarchs and Saints, and also because of his bold eloquence, it is fitting that the Archdiocese Oratorial Festival be named after this most celebrated preacher in the history of the Christian Church.
