He will refer to current methodologies and techniques for the teaching of the Greek language by means of using Art and Applied Theater. In addition, he will provide ways of interdisciplinary teaching of Religion and the Greek Language.

Ms. Caren Moncher Zayde, Executive Director, Division of Nonpublic Schools, New York City Department of Education, will address all the teachers at lunch time.
