The Direct Archdiocesan District Office of Education is pleased to announce that the **2015 Comprehensive Examination in Modern Greek** will be administered on **Monday, June 22**nd, from **1:15 p.m.** to **4:15 p.m.**

The Comprehensive Examination in Modern Greek is "a locally developed foreign language examination," aligned to the Checkpoint B learning standards for Languages Other Than English (LOTE) as described in the Syllabus: Modern Languages for Communication of the New York State Education Department.

The *Examination* assesses the student's language skills in speaking, listening, reading, and writing the Modern Greek language. To qualify for the *Examination*, students must be in the eighth grade or higher and have successfully completed **three years** of studies in the Modern Greek language.

The Comprehensive Examination in Modern Greek may afford high school students, who pursue studies in the Modern Greek language for more than two years, the opportunity to earn a Regents diploma with advanced designation (NYCRR §100.5[b][7][v][c]). However, awarding of credits for foreign language studies is at the discretion of the public or private school principal.
