2018 Malta Scholarship - Application Instructions

Attached is a **Checklist and Application for the 2018 Malta Scholarship**. Please read the following instructions very carefully. Candidates must submit a completed application and all required documentation to the Scholarship Committee by the due date in order to be considered for a scholarship. One or more scholarships of \$1,000 will be awarded.

The application is three pages long and must be filled out in its entirety. All of the required documentation also needs to be included with your submission (see list below and the Checklist for details). Make sure you include the Checklist as the top page of your completed application. Please print clearly. The deadline for submitting your completed application is May 4, 2018.

It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that his/her application is complete.

As designated by the donor, selection of the recipients will be based on the following criteria:

- **Candidates must provide evidence of true financial need.**
- **Preference will be given to candidates who are orphans (one or both parents).**
- Candidates must be of the **Eastern Orthodox faith**, within one of the jurisdictions of the “Assembly of Canonical Orthodox Bishops of North and Central America” (see application for a detailed list). Applicants must also provide evidence of being involved in church and parish activities.
- At the time of application, candidates must be high school seniors and beginning their undergraduate degree program in the fall of 2018 or already a full-time matriculated student committed to serious study on a **full-time** basis in an **undergraduate degree program** at an **accredited college or university**.
- Candidates **must be citizens or permanent residents** of the United States. Proof of permanent residency is required i.e. copy of Birth Certificate; Naturalization Certificate; Permanent Residency Documents.
- Candidates must have achieved and must provide proof of a combined new SAT minimum score of 1500*, or older SAT minimum score of 1000. If the SAT were not taken, another measure used by the academic community, for example the ACT, should be substituted. * Note: The new SAT writing section may be waived.
- Applicants must have maintained a minimum grade point average of at least a B, 80, or 3.0 through high school and must submit their high school transcripts as proof.
- **Students already enrolled in college must submit both current college transcripts, as well as their final high school transcripts, including SAT (or ACT) test scores.**

Malta Scholarship Instructions (continued)

- Students should be undertaking studies in the sciences, business or the arts.
- Candidates must submit a fully completed application to the Scholarship Committee. The application is three pages long, and all sections must to be filled out. **Please print clearly.**
- Your submission must also include **all** the required documentation as highlighted on the Checklist and listed below. **Make sure your application submission includes the following documents (additional details available on the Checklist):**
 1. **Official transcripts from high school and college (if applicable).**
 2. **Letter of acceptance (for those entering college) or proof that you are a full-time student (for those already attending college). i.e., tuition statement.**
 3. Copies of the most current **Federal Income Tax Returns** (your parents' return and your return if you did paid work).
 4. A copy or transcript of your **Baptismal or Chrismation Certificate. Birth certificates are not acceptable.**
 5. Three (3) **Letters of Recommendation** (one **must** be from an Orthodox Clergyman).
 6. An **essay** (topics are listed on the checklist).
 7. **A brief resume (2 pages maximum)**, including information about yourself, as detailed on the checklist.

Use the checklist to make sure you have included every item in your submission.

Recommendation letters can be sent directly to the committee from the individuals writing them or you can collect them and submit them with the rest of your documents. In either case, the applicant is responsible for ensuring that these letters, as well as all pieces of your application, are received by the committee.

The candidate should be available for a telephone interview at the Committee's discretion.

Checklist: The following items must be enclosed with your application:

- Official Transcript(s)** Include High School transcripts and if already at college, any current college transcripts plus SAT and/or ACT testing records.
- A Letter of Acceptance** OR **Proof that you are a full-time student**
(For those entering college in Fall 2018.) (If you are already attending a college or university.)
- Copies of **Federal Income Tax Returns** - Your parents' return and your return if you worked.
- A copy or transcript of your **Baptismal or Chrismation Certificate (NOT a birth certificate)**
- Three (3) Letters of Recommendation** - They should be from: 1) a Teacher/Professor, 2) an Employer and 3) an Orthodox Clergyman (**required**). The letters should address: a) your academic record, and b) your extracurricular activities, such as community service or parish activities.
- An **Essay** - Your essay (one page maximum) should address the reason(s) you are applying for this scholarship and how your planned studies, with receipt of this scholarship, will help you serve the Church and/or the community at large.
- A **brief resume** (2-page maximum), **including the following information:**
 - Honors and Awards (only most significant honors/awards—academic and others; date received)
 - Language(s) (including proficiency levels)
 - Special skills (any skills, abilities, or appropriate experiences you feel better qualify you for this scholarship)
 - Extracurricular information: activities, esp. at church; volunteer/community service; special programs; paid or unpaid employment and/or internships. Please include name(s) of organization(s), years of involvement with each, brief description of program, service or work responsibilities. For employment and internships please list hours/week.

Both your signature and your parent's or guardian's signature are required.
