2019 Gioles Scholarship - Application Instructions

Attached is a **Checklist and Application for the 2019 Gioles Scholarship**. Please make sure you read these instructions very carefully. Candidates must submit a completed application with all required documentation to the Scholarship Committee by the due date in order to be considered for an award. One or more scholarships of \$1,000 will be awarded. At least one award is reserved for a candidate who has chosen to study **Journalism**.

The application is three pages long and must be filled out in its entirety. All required documentation must be included with your submission (see list below and the Checklist for details). Make sure you include the Checklist as the top page of your completed application. The committee will not consider incomplete applications. Please print clearly. The deadline for submitting your completed application is **May 3, 2019.**

It is the responsibility of each applicant to ensure that his/her application is complete.

As designated by the donor, selection of the recipients will be based on the following criteria:

- **This is a scholarship based on need, and all candidates *must* provide evidence of true financial need.**
- **Preference will be given to candidates who are *orphans* (one or both parents).**
- Candidates must be active in a local Greek Orthodox parish of the **Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America**, with preference given to those having **Greek ancestry**.
- Candidates must be at least high school seniors at the time of application and beginning school in the fall of 2019 or they should already be full-time matriculated students. Only students committed to serious study on a full-time basis in an **undergraduate degree program** at an **accredited college or university in the United States** can apply.
- Candidates **must be citizens or permanent residents** of the United States. Proof of permanent residency is required i.e. copy of Birth Certificate; Naturalization Certificate; Permanent Residency Documents.
- Applicants must provide the Scholarship Committee with evidence of their scholastic standing, including high school transcripts with a minimum grade point average B, 80, or 3.0.
- Candidates must have achieved and must provide proof of a combined SAT minimum score of at least 1000. If the SATs were not taken, another measure used by the academic community, for example the ACT, could be substituted.
- **Students already enrolled in college must also submit their current college transcripts, as well as their high school transcripts, plus their SAT (or ACT) test scores.**
- Candidates must submit a fully completed application to the Scholarship Committee. The application is three pages long, and all sections need to be filled out. **Please print clearly.**

- **All** the required documentation, as highlighted on the Checklist and listed below, **must** also be included with your submission.
- **Make sure your application submission includes the following:**
 1. **Official transcripts from high school and if applicable from college.**
 2. **Letter of acceptance (for those entering college in August/September 2019) or proof that you are a full-time student (for those already attending college), i.e., tuition statement, letter from registrar, etc.**
 3. **Copies of most current Federal Income Tax Returns** (your parents' return **and** your return, if you did paid work).
 4. A copy or transcript of your **Baptismal or Chrismation Certificate**. **Birth certificates are not acceptable.**
 5. Three (3) **Letters of Recommendation**. One **must** be from a Greek Orthodox priest.
 6. An **essay** (topics are listed on the checklist).
 7. A **brief resume (2 pages maximum)**, including information about yourself, as detailed on the checklist.

Use the checklist to make sure you have included every item in your submission.

Recommendation letters can be sent directly to the committee from the individuals writing them or you can collect them and submit them with the rest of your documents. In either case, the applicant is responsible for ensuring that these letters, as well as any other documents, are received by the committee.

The candidate should be available for a telephone interview at the Committee's discretion.

ALL THE CHECKLIST ITEMS BELOW MUST BE INCLUDED WITH YOUR COMPLETELY FILLED-IN APPLICATION (*all 3 pages*) for proper processing by the Scholarship Committee. If there are any missing pieces your application will not be considered by the committee.

Checklist: The following items must be enclosed with your application:

- Official Transcript(s)** Include High School transcripts and if already in college, any current college transcripts, plus SAT and/or ACT testing records.
- Letter of Acceptance** (For those entering college in Fall 2019) OR **Proof that you are a full-time student** (If you are already attending a college or university)
- Copies of **Federal Income Tax Returns** - Your parent(s)' return **and** your return if you worked.
- A copy or transcript of your **Baptismal** or **Chrismation Certificate** (**NOT** a birth certificate)
- Three (3) Letters of Recommendation** - One of these letters **MUST** be from a Clergyman and should address your parish activities. The others should be from: 1) a Teacher/Professor and 2) an Employer or anyone else who knows you well. The letters should address: a) your academic record, and b) your extracurricular activities, such as community service.
- An **Essay:** The requisite Essay must be no more than 500 words, typed, double-spaced, on **one** of the following topics:
 1. How has your background as an orphan, OR as one of Greek descent, OR as a Greek Orthodox Christian molded your life?
 2. How can Hellenes abroad or Greek Orthodox Christians, especially in the United States of America, retain their religious and ethnic identity for generations to come?
 3. Using the wealth of Hellenic Culture, as well as your Greek Orthodox Faith, in combination with your planned studies, how will you contribute to the betterment of Humanity?
- A **brief resume** (2-page maximum), **including the following information:**
 - Honors and Awards (most significant honors/awards—academic and others; date received)
 - Language(s) (including proficiency levels)
 - Special skills (any skills, abilities, or appropriate experiences you feel better qualify you for this scholarship)
 - Extracurricular information: Activities, esp. at church; volunteer/community service; special programs; paid or unpaid employment and/or internships. Please include name(s) of organization(s), years of involvement with each, brief description of program, service or work responsibilities. For employment and internships please list hours/week.

Have you completed your **Checklist** and reviewed that **all** of the items required are included with your scholarship submission? **Have you signed the application/release form?**
Both your signature and your parent's or guardian's signature are required.
