### **THE 2022 CHRISTOS and GEORGIA TRAKATELLIS FELLOWSHIP**

#### **General Information**

The Christos and Georgia Trakatellis Fellowship Fund was created by His Eminence Archbishop Demetrios and his brother Prof. Antonios Trakatellis in memory of their parents, Christos and Georgia for the purpose of offering financial assistance to graduates of Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology to study Greek language, Hellenic culture and liturgical practices here or preferably in Greece or at the Ecumenical Patriarchate in Constantinople. The study could be part of an established academic program (Doctoral or Master Levels) or part of a free program, which, however, should be well structured and clearly defined in view of the above stated purpose of the fund.

Candidates for Fellowships shall be selected based on “merit” and “need”. As stated above, **the Fellowship is available only to graduates of Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology**. The amount of the Fellowship is \$3,000 per semester for up to two semesters a year, totaling \$6,000. One or more full, or partial, Fellowships shall be awarded annually.

#### **Procedures for Applying**

Candidates need to complete the attached application and submit it together with the following documentation:

- A complete **Academic Record** (including undergraduate and graduate transcripts, past and present)
- A **Curriculum Vitae**
- A statement outlining the candidate’s proposed **program of activities**
- **Three letters of recommendation** (one must be from someone at Holy Cross School of Theology, one should be from a clergyman and one from a non-clergyman)
- A **Budget and/or Statement of Need** outlining sources of financial support as well as a calculation of expenses related to the intended field of study.

### **THE 2022 CHRISTOS and GEORGIA TRAKATELLIS FELLOWSHIP Renewal Procedures for 2022**

#### **General Information**

The Chancellor's Office of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America oversees the Trakatellis Fellowship Fund and is responsible for awarding fellowships on an annual basis. In order to be eligible to renew this fellowship, candidates must be continuing their academic work in the same program for which they were awarded the fellowship in the previous year.

Candidates who would like to apply for a fellowship renewal must complete the attached application and submit it together with all the documentation requested below. Candidates will be selected based on "merit" and "need", and **applying does not guarantee an award**. The amount of the fellowship is \$3,000 per semester for up to two semesters a year, totaling \$6,000. One or more full, or partial, fellowships shall be awarded annually.

#### **Fellowship Renewal Procedures**

Along with a completed renewal application, all of the following items must also be submitted before a fellowship renewal will be considered:

- A letter, addressed to the Chancellor of the Archdiocese, which should include information on the academic program being pursued, with details on the progress the applicant is making in his/her program and an anticipated date of completion. The letter should also include details of estimated educational expenses (e.g., tuition, books, travel, etc.) for the upcoming academic year, and an accounting of how these expenses will be funded (scholarships, grants, loans, etc.).
- A letter from an Academic Advisor showing satisfactory progress in the program.
- A letter from the institution the applicant is attending confirming they are continuing their studies in the 2022-2023 academic year.
